Spring Fair

- Bottle collection continuing until to March 13. Grade 7s are doing the tally. We have lots of books & DVDs. Not as many bottles but should have enough to play the game.
- Basket raffle: Michelle Osing found a parent coordinator for each division. Discussion had over selling raffle tickets ahead of time through home sales for random baskets or at only at event where people could put their tickets in for specific baskets. Decided to send tickets home on March 30 for random baskets. Discussion over someone approaching Save On Foods to sell raffle tickets out front. Corinne will look into the gaming license. Deborah, Stephanie and Michelle O will be approaching businesses for donations.
- Ryan Wellington has agreed to be the food supplier. Terynn and Danielle will be meeting with him to settle on a menu..thinking pulled pork, coleslaw, hot dogs, pop, coffee, tea. They propose pre selling food tickets and game tickets and have envelopes for each family at a will call table through the munch a lunch program. Tickets will still be sold at the event.
- Another company - Cotton Candy Kids - does popcorn, cotton candy and snow cones. The company gives 25% of the profit to the school. Food Budget isn't set yet. In the past PAC was invoiced after the fact in the past. Ryan can't remember what the quantities of pulled pork ordered last event was just remembers it was sold out. March 30-April 9 could be the days open to pre order and would give Ryan an idea how much to buy. (One week). Discussion about having Cobs attend? Vote says no.
- Leanne Belsham found a bouncy castle vendor that rents western theme castles but the cost is 3 times that of the regular castles. Decision to go for regular castle with a parent volunteer manning the event.
- We can borrow 2 games from Port Guichon for free. Toilet seat toss and a pachinko type of game. Stephanie will look at her work to see what she can get.
- Motion for gaming budget set to \$1500: Corinne; Stephanie seconded. All in favour.
- Cinema zoo, a mobile petting zoo has a trailer complete with hand sanitizing stations is available for \$375 for two hours. Decision is this is too expensive. The Delta humane society hasn't gotten back to Leanne. O.W.L. does a 60 min presentation for \$150 donation. Leanne will ask O.W.L. if they are available for something that's shorter. We approve the donation cost but this would be part of the gaming budget.
- Fire department. Danielle has talked to them and it sounds like they don't mind coming to the event but they are not confirmed.

- Police department Canine team. Bob will see if he can find out who we should contact and will let Leanne know.
- Esme will contact delta to have the fair put on their electronic billboard.
- Deborah ordered two tents from envision for the outside (eating area & ticket sales).
- Poster board signs. Jen Barker may be able to do these (?) Leanne will check.
- Need a volunteer to man the rolling volunteer board.
- Next spring fair meeting March 10 at school 7pm.

Playground Update

- Fourth reading has been done for the Marina Gardens development. Mr. Thompson will contact polygon over donation possibility.
- Captains Cove called Marilyn to say that Newton Chan will likely be interested in some financial support of the playground but a dollar amount is unknown until after he returns to Canada on March 15.
