Navigating Conflicts & Mistakes

School is a place to learn and that learning isn't just about academics. It's important that we help children learn to navigate conflicts in positive and respectful ways to help them become their best selves.

MAKING IT RIGHT

- Own your choices:
 I shouldn't have ...
- 2. Identify the Problem: It was wrong because ...
 - 3. Make a plan: Next time I will ...

We are starting with this, "Making it Right" restorative practice that's in kid-friendly language. Staff, including our Noon Hour Supervisors and I will be using this language to work through situations that come up with students.

I will be introducing this at our first assembly.

We'll talk about the importance of owning our choices, knowing that everyone makes mistakeseven adults, and to be kind and respectful humans we need to understand the impact our words and actions have on others, and learn to do things differently.

Learning takes patience and time. With practice, we know that our students will develop their skills to take ownership of their words and actions, identify how their actions and words may not fit with our school S.O.A.R. agreements, and be able to make plans to do things differently the next time they are in similar situations.

We hope that you'll begin hearing your children using this language and would love to hear from you!

Updated Daily Health Check

A health check means a person regularly checking to ensure they (or their child) are not experiencing symptoms of illness (including but not limited to COVID-19 symptoms) that would limit their ability to participate fully in regular activities before coming to school to prevent spread of communicable diseases, such as COVID-19, within school settings.

Common symptoms of communicable disease include:

- fever or chills
- stuffy or runny nose
- sore throat
- cough
- headaches
- muscle or body aches
- fatigue

Do not attend school or work if you are sick. Anyone exhibiting new symptoms of illness (including COVID-19) should stay home and follow guidance provided by the BC Centre for Disease Control.

Communicable Diseases Plan

Though we are in a much better place and able to function closer to what we have been used to, we aren't yet completely in "normal" times. Schools no longer have to create individual safety plans or individual communicable diseases plans, but will now have routines and systems that use the Delta School district's Communicable Diseases plan.
