TREASURER'S REPORT:

BANK ACCOUNTS

General Bank Account

As of January 25, 2024, the PAC has general funds of \$29,126 (November 30, 2023 - \$23,841). Since the last report date on November 30, the PAC received \$12,654 from: \$10,525 from Munchalunch for the Spring lunch and milk purchases,

\$1,076 for the holiday breakfast event,

\$585 for the front row raffle,

\$348 for the Purdy's fundraiser, and

\$120 in donations at the holiday breakfast.

Since November 30, the PAC spent general \$7,369 on:

\$2,657 on Big Box fundraiser purchases,

\$2,477 on Hot Lunch expenses,

\$1,321 on Milk purchases.

\$457 on breakfast purchases,

\$448 as a deposit for the Spring Fair games (refundable up until 7 days to event), and \$9 on transaction fees.

We are expecting \$143 from the January bottle drive.

Gaming Bank Account

As of January 25, 2024, the PAC has gaming funds of \$17,935 (November 30, 2023 - \$17,935). There has been no change since the last PAC meeting.

GAMING FUNDS:

The annual gaming grant funds expires three years after the dates received. Gaming event funds expire one year after the gaming events. Because the funds expire and can only be spent on specified items, gaming funds should be spent first where possible, before using general funds. The funds expire as follows:

\$5,559 received from the raffle ticket, 50/50 & Spring Fair cakes – expires May 11, 2024 \$296 received 50/50 net proceeds received October 14, 2023 – expires October 14, 2024

\$4,120 received on November 30, 2021 - expires November 30, 2024

\$4,000 received September 28, 2022 – expires September 28, 2025

\$3,960 received October 5, 2023 – expires October 5, 2026

\$17,935 gaming funds as of January 25, 2024

\$75 is payable for reimbursement of annual BCCPAC fees, leaving \$9,900 that must be spent in 2024.

The PAC voted in June 2023 to prioritize funds to replace the stand-alone old blue monkey bars with something new on the playground. In November, the District offered an alternative. Gaming funds are available for other ways to improve the playground (i.e. something new, refresh soccer nets, etc.)

Resolution: To spend up to \$325 of gaming funds for the class skating fieldtrips - motioned by Diane Chubb, seconded by Ronnie Nugent. Passed unanimously.

Resolution: To reallocate 22,000\$ (17000\$ gaming, and up to 5000\$ general funds) to go towards playground replacement - Jann to bring this amount forward to Sukhi for review with approved vendors, who will then in turn review space and offer bid to NG. - motioned by Niki Kehoe-Madsen, seconded by Ronnie Nugent. Passed unanimously.

Resolution: Soccer nets - deferred to next PAC meeting

DPAC REPORT:

We had Patrick Klassen come in to discuss inclusive learning, he is the director of learning services for delta school district.

Delta inclusion definition is a welcoming place for staff and students. It is a mindset and practice. It is about changing the system as a whole.

Delta school district websites offer an inclusive learning handbook which all parents can access.

The handbook discusses multi tier system to assist our children.

Tier one: universal support. This support is designed for ALL

Tier two: targeted support. This support is in addition to tier one

Tier three: essential support. This is in addition to tier one and two.

They are in the process of hiring some new positions in the district. Tier one classroom support and coordinator for social and emotional support.

Erase.gov.bc.ca

Is an excellent website for mental health. Expect safe, caring and respectful digital communities. On this website you can report bullying. Fill out an anonymous report, it gets sent to the principal which they need to follow up.

DPAC will be hosting two capacity cafe in April and May. High school students discuss their thoughts and feelings to parents, but it is behind a closed door so you can not see their faces. Parents can not comment. They are there is listen only. Dinner will be

provided. More details to follow. This is located at Sands Secondary school in person only.

Zoom only presentation by Marvin Crank on substance abuse K-12 in April or May. More details to follow.

Subcommittee Verbal Reports:

- Fruit & Veg (nil subcommittee members in attendance): As needed, extra volunteers with food safe to assist with dispensing. Kyla, Brigitte, Ashley, Kristin volunteered.
- Free Milk (Kyla)
- Hot Lunch (Brigitte in attendance). Hot lunch for remainder of year underway Open to feedback, discussion defer to next meeting
 - Milk Program- nil subcommittee members in attendance. Milk that was not able to be dispensed during the snow closure was handed out on days following the return to school.

The monkey bars are scheduled to come out this Friday (Pro D) and the area will be filled to look like it was never there. Unfortunately there is no piece coming out of Hawthorne for NG. The structure removed was much older than what is there now and could not be brought up to the current code.

As well, the platforms from there would not fit the ones at NG because they were created by two different companies and neither are in existence any more. Ongoing search for ideas on replacement of the platforms on the primary playground. Needs to works within the Canadian Playground Safety Regulations and students as well.

Other business:

- Mr. Tube steak kickback not received from Open House Sept 21 will not pursue any longer. No response from them other than to confirm May 15th is available and penciled in.
- January 13 10:00am to 12:00pm raised \$140 in the Thank you Senga, Jennifer, Angela, and Diane!
- Variety Grant to outfit the NEST
 - Closed as of now. We are on mailing list to apply once new submissions are being accepted.

- Can be applied for online <u>directly from their website</u>.
- \$10 fee per child for Emergency Preparedness.
 - Won't be implemented until at least 24/25. Talk about next year.
